LESSON: Searching for Meaning through Jigsaw Discussions

GRADE: 3

OBJECTIVES:

Civic Literacy

SS.3-5.PSCI.1 Understand the rights and responsibilities of each citizen and demonstrate the value of lifelong civic action.

- Understand why civic responsibility is important and know examples of civic responsibility, (such as good land stewardship).
- Understand opportunities for leadership and public service in the student's own classroom, school, community, state, and the nation.

MATERIALS & RESOURCES:

- Books:
 - If You Find a Rock, Christian
 - A Seed is Sleepy by Hutts Aston
 - Compost! Growing Gardens from Your Garbage, Glaser
 - The Good Garden, Milway
 - The Pumpkin Circle by Levenson
 - Definition of "environment" on board or flipchart

PRESENTATION:

Review the definition for "Environment – the area in which we exist or live", with the students. Show students the books they will be reading. Explain that each book has a message for us about nature and our environment.

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DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Divide the class into 5 groups, assigning one book to each.
- 2. Give groups some time to read the books.
- 3. Explain that we'll be playing a game called "jigsaw" to share what we've learned from our book with the other groups.
- 4. Have one student from each group move to a new group, (i.e. one from group 1 goes to group 2; one from group 2 goes to group 3, etc.)
- 5. Now the new person in each group shares what his or her group read.
- 6. Allow time for discussion about the theme of each book.
- 7. Continue rotating until each group has heard about all 5 books.
- 8. As a follow-up, the teacher can write a few ideas from students on what they've learned next to the name of each book.

TIME: 60-80 min

PROCESSING THROUGH THE SIX PILLARS:

WHAT:

• What was the message each book had about the environment?

SO WHAT:

- Do we have rules at school, which help make the environment a better place?
- Do we have rules in nature, which make our outdoor environment a better place?
- Who makes the rules?
- Who follows the rules?

NOW WHAT:

- What could happen to our environment if someone does not follow the rules?
- Can you think of ways in which our City government keeps the community clean and beautiful?
